Last April, deputies from the Monroe Co. Sheriff's Office, Bruce Scheitlin(IUAW servicing rep) and myself addressed the Monroe Co. Board of Supervisors' meeting over concerns of the lack of proper deputy staffing in the sheriff's office. We demonstrated that Monroe Co. ranks at the very bottom of deputy staffing in Iowa counties with similar populations. We were told they would take our request under consideration. Sheriff deputies are first responders and adequate staffing of their department should be a top priority in the county's budget. Their most basic function as an organization is to serve and protect the public. The citizens of Monroe Co. anticipate qualified professionals to provide the law enforcement services they expect and pay taxes to receive. However, with an understaffed sheriff's office, not only has it become increasingly difficult to provide the quality of service they are entitled to receive; officer and citizen safety are of critical concern.

As Monroe Co. approaches approving their budget for the upcoming year, I have made a written request asking again for an additional deputy to be hired. If you're a resident of Monroe Co. show some solidarity and contact your county supervisors and ask them to support our request.

Bruce and I have also started contract negotiations for the Albia Police and the Street and Sanitation Department. The Republican's gutting of Iowa Code Chapter 20 governing collective bargaining for public sector workers in our state has made it extremely difficult to negotiate a fair contract but we feel confident that we will make some gains with cooperation of city officials.
